She went to bathtub and kneeled down and cried; then got up and asked to be released to get ice for her face. Husband refused. She became angry and slid items from bathroom vanity to floor. Husband took son and went outside. She followed and pounded on the car window because she wanted the insurance card so she could go to the hospital.</p>	<p>Sheriff's department victim information form documents one 14 year old son, but this boy's statement mentions having a little brother who was also present during the incident.</p> <p>Boys were also apparently present during a previous incident April 2005, as victim said at that time he took his children out to eat and his son to a movie. At that time, victim told deputy that his wife had been violent in the past with an 18 year old daughter.</p>		<p>14 year old son came to police station while his father was talking to officer, and said he and his little brother were playing video games. He heard his parents arguing and heard his mother say "I should beat the shit out of him." He also heard banging. As he and his father left home, his mother came outside and pounded on his car window and took the keys as if to key the vehicle. His father gave her an insurance card.</p>	<p>Officer examined vehicle but could not find any damage or marks.</p> <p>Female gave permission for officer to look in bathroom, which had been cleaned. No items were on floor. She showed officer trash can, which had broken Dixie cup dispenser and damaged motorized toothbrush.</p>
2	<p>Admitted to pushing each other, wrestling with each other and pulling each other's hair. She had scrape to left knee. Said that happened when she and husband were wrestling on bed. She said her husband also pushed her into the wall, causing her to hit her back on the wall. She also had scrapes to left calf and left forearm.</p>	<p>He and wife began arguing when he told her she needed to get a job. They began pushing each other and pulling each other's hair. He acknowledged that his wife injured her knee during the physical altercation.
